- Due every 5th of the month

MRF Terms

- Service Hour
 - 60 minutes of work performed by a dues-paid member of a CKI club on a service project approved by the club or club board of officers
 - On MRF, add up all service hours from each member during an event to get # of Hours Service Performed
 - i.e- Person A volunteer 3 hours, Person B volunteered 2 hours at the same event: 5 hours of service performed

MRF terms cont.

- K-Family Relations

- There are at least two members of a Kiwanis family group (Key Club, Kiwanis, etc) at a Circle K meeting, service project, or other event, or two or more Circle K members at a K family event.

- On the report, if you have 2 Kiwanis Members from the Kiwanis Club A walking the dogs, this is 1 K-Family Relations. The Kiwanis are guest so there are 2 guests.

- Interclub
 - Take members (at least two from each club) from at least two Circle K Clubs together at an event (district events like fall rally and district convention DON'T count, sorry).
 - For this, you put how many other clubs were there. For example, if OSU a social and Kent and Akron were there, you'd put "two" for number of interclubs.
